Electrical Maintenance Management and Failure Analysis

5 day course

Classroom, online or in-house

Course overview

Electrical maintenance is frequently run to a schedule inherited from a manufacturer's manual, on equipment operating under conditions the manufacturer never assumed. This course covers running it on evidence instead. Delegates work through building an asset register with criticality assessment, selecting a maintenance strategy per asset from run to failure through to condition based, and constructing the inspection and testing programme that follows. Failure analysis is the second half: establishing what actually failed and why, distinguishing a component failure from a system cause, and using failure data to change the strategy. The course closes on measuring maintenance performance and on justifying the budget in terms of avoided loss.

What you will learn

- Build an asset register with a defensible criticality assessment
- Select a maintenance strategy per asset rather than per manual
- Construct an inspection and testing programme from that strategy
- Analyse a failure to establish what failed and why
- Distinguish a component failure from a system level cause
- Use failure data to revise the maintenance strategy
- Measure maintenance performance and justify the budget in avoided loss
