Course overview

Improvement systems fail at the leadership layer far more often than at the tool layer. This course is for the managers whose behaviour determines whether an operational excellence approach takes hold. Delegates work through what leaders must personally do differently, the review routines that either build problem solving capability or suppress it, the handling of bad news, and the resource and priority decisions that signal whether the organisation means it. The course is direct about the common pattern of a leadership team commissioning an improvement programme and then continuing to manage exactly as before, and about the resourcing and patience the approach actually requires.

- Identify what leaders must personally do differently for the system to hold
- Run review routines that build problem solving rather than suppress it
- Handle bad news so it continues to be reported
- Make resource and priority decisions that signal genuine commitment
- Recognise when a programme has become decoration
- Set realistic expectations for pace and resourcing
- Hold the approach when short term results are under pressure
